

# **2019 Better Beaches Program Report**

The Boston Harbor cleanup not only revitalized the marine environment, it also brought new life to the region's public beaches. Cleaner water created greater opportunities for the beaches to be vibrant public spaces for the more than 2 million people who live near beaches from Nahant to Nantasket. The Better Beaches Program was created to make the most of those opportunities by providing community-specific and culturally relevant programming.

Every beach, like every community, is unique. The Better Beaches Program puts funds in the hands of local beach lovers, supporting and empowering them to dream up, plan, and execute events for their beach. From movie nights to beach festivals, fitness classes to speaker series and more, the Better Beaches Program meets people where they are and supports their creativity and passion.

#### This year, Save the Harbor's Better Beaches Program:

- Awarded \$211,320 to 37 organizations
- Invested our one-millionth dollar in free Better • Beaches events and programs
- Supported 233 events including 38 festivals, movie • nights, concerts, and beach parties; and 25 fitness boot camps, sailing and kayaking sessions, speaker series, and summer-long programs
- Connected more than I million people to 23 beaches and waterfront parks

## **Better Beaches Program 2019**

This year's Better Beaches Program has certainly been one for the record books. Our staff helped lead programs on every Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR) beach from Nahant to Nantasket. We've worked with incredible community members, activists, and advocates in each community, and seen so many smiling faces. Watching a beach come to life with games, food, art, and educational activities has been inspiring – and fun! The success of the Better Beaches Program reminds us how important the beaches are as cultural resources for all, gathering spots for communities, and places for recreation, exploration, and education.

Save the Harbor/Save the Bay has led and managed the Better Beaches Program Partnership with the DCR for more than a decade. In that time, this remarkable program spurred more than \$5 million in investment in free public activities on the region's beaches.

Since 2008, our community partners in Nahant, Lynn, Revere, Winthrop, East Boston, South Boston, Dorchester, Quincy, and Hull have leveraged \$1,097,988 in small grants received through the Better Beaches Program into \$3,617,741 in organizational support from Save the Harbor and cash and inkind contributions from local government and small businesses. That resulted in a total investment of \$4,715,749 in 870 free events and programs for the nearly 2 million regional residents who live within a short ride or drive to the beach.

This year, we granted \$211,320 to 37 organizations, including 8 new grantees, and supported 8 Life's a Beach Festivals.

Funds for the Better Beaches Program come from both the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and our Harpoon Shamrock Splash. We are grateful to our partners in the Legislature, the Baker-Polito Administration, our foundation and corporate funding partners, and to everyone who makes the Harpoon Shamrock Splash a success. We are pleased to report that the Commonwealth has once again included funds to support the program in the budget for the 2020 season, and we look forward to seeing you all out at the Splash again in March!
